We are proud to present the work of Charles Hawley, on display at the library from May 1st through June 29th.

Charles Hawley dedicated his life to preserving the beauty of Lake George, both through his art and through environmental leadership. For nearly 30 years, he served on the Lake George Park Commission, nine as chairman. He also served as councilman and supervisor of the Town of Lake George, chairman of the steering committee for the Lake George Park management plan, chairman of the Lake Champlain-Lake George regional planning board, and advisor to the study commissioned for the future of the Adirondack Park.

A graduate of the College of Fine Arts at Carnegie Institute (Carnegie Mellon University), Hawley painted extensively in the Adirondacks, Rocky Mountains, Canada, Alaska, and Hawaii. Charles Hawley was a life-long resident of Lake George - 1923 - 2010.

Thank you to the Hawley family and the Lake George Arts Project for making this exhibit possible. A reception celebrating Charles Hawley's work will be held at the library on May 15th at 6:30 pm.

Notes from the Archives: Stereoscopes

One quiet afternoon in winter 2000, I discovered the window seats in the library were hinged - maybe there were some cool things in them! So, I pried them open - one was just a collection of old cables and electric cords. The other was a treasure trove.

Many patrons reminisced fondly about the stereoptic slides that they had looked at when they were small. That collection of viewers and slides was in the window seat. There were hundreds of slides and two viewers. I had been allowed to use my grandparents' collection when I was a child and I had fun that afternoon looking at all the old slides.

Stereoptic viewers were popular after 1851, when one was first exhibited at the London Exposition, until the 1930s, when motion pictures became common. The discoverer of stereoptics and inventor of the first viewer was Sir Charles Wheatstone. "In June 1838, the British scientist Charles Wheatstone published a paper describing a curious illusion he had discovered. If you drew two pictures of something—say, a cube, or a tree from two slightly different perspectives, and then viewed each one through a different eye, your brain would assemble them into a threedimensional view." (Smithsonian)

Wheatstone's viewer was large and a little cumbersome. The stereoptic craze really took off after the invention of the portable viewer by David Brewster. Oliver Wendell Holmes went on to invent a hand-held viewer like the ones the library owns, and the craze for stereoptics was on.

By 1901 Underwood & Underwood, a London Firm, was printing 25,000 slides a day. Everyone who had the means had a viewer and collection of slides to share with guests.

"European views were frequently of famous ancient landmarks, castles, and cathedrals. The United States—a young country—did not have any antiquity, so stereographers instead recorded America's epic landscape: the canyons of the West, the soaring peaks of Yosemite. Americans also loved scenes from abroad, peering excitedly at Egyptian camels, Central American women pounding tortilla flour, dirigibles in flight, exploding volcanoes. Victorian-era travel was too expensive for anyone but the wealthy, so the stereograph provided virtual voyaging for the emerging middle class." (Thompson:2017)

It was common for families to invite friends over to view slides, but it was not all just entertainment. Underwood & Underwood marketed a series of 100 slides called "A Journey Through the Holy Land." There were travel collections with guidebooks; and collections for schools accompanied by teaching guides. Teachers felt the students retained more information when it was presented with visuals (early virtual reality), and the 3-D effect made it even more realistic. "The stereograph is a superior kind of text, and a good teacher will not have so much trust in mere print," wrote the Underwood & Underwood company in its teacher manual, *The World Visualized for the Classroom*. (Thompson:2017)

The popularity of stereoptics declined with the advent of motion pictures in the 1930's, but the moments from time caught on the stereoptic slides still fascinate us today.
