

Project Local: Terry Teitelbaum Exhibition

Our latest Project Local exhibit features painting by Terry Teitelbaum. Terry reflects, "I paint to capture the texture and color of the influences in my life, and to tell a story. The finished piece transmits that story to others. My style reflects the flow I seek in life; each painting takes on a life of its own."

Teitelbaum received degrees in fashion design from the Fashion Institute of Technology (FIT) in New York City and from Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, and won awards at Pratt for her designs. She set up a studio on her property in Cambridge, N.Y. and continued her exploration of style, design and color through custom design work as well as supervising the design and construction of costumes for Bennington College's Theater Department in Vermont. After decades of working with thousands of yards of fabric and a variety of textures and colors, Teitelbaum was ready to expand her creative exploration. Feeling an intense desire to use pigment to express her inner thoughts, she picked up a paint brush and began a new direction: painting. Her medium gradually evolved to include oil paint, pastels, and other mixed media.





Historic Lake George Guidebooks

The library archives hold some interesting Lake George guidebooks. *Lake George* by J.P. Sweet is a guide to visiting the Lake George area, published in 1863. The entire 54 pages were written in verse. Little biographical information is available about Sweet, and he only published one other booklet, but there is little doubt that he was quite familiar with the area. Sweet starts his description at the Lake George Village, sidetracks to Dunham's Bay and continues north to Ticonderoga. His style is flowery by today's standards,

The opening lines-

"Ho! For Lake George the Lake of Many Isles Embeded the the Northern Wildes"-

Gives an idea of his general style.

However, artistry did not stand in the way of very practical advice on affordable sightseeing -

"We now have reached Mohican's pleasant pier. Where Captain Wilson holds forth every year; Yes, ev'ry month, and week, and live long day, He'll entertain you for a moderate pay;"

Sweet recommended several hotels and restaurants, including Fort William Henry, Carpenters and Mr. Fuller's near 14 Mile Island. He was especially interested in where a good meal could be had - he recommended Captain Wilson's "fine game dinners, with his bass and trout."

Sweet seemed to have a real interest in recording stories about local characters that have long been forgotten. One of the strangest is about someone who constructed a fence whose pickets were made from dried rattlesnake tails

In contrast, Elizabeth Eggleston Seelye was all business. Her guide books were published starting in 1892 and went through at least a dozen editions. She came from a wealthy family and most of her education was private. She spoke both French and German. She married Elwin Seelye and moved to Lake George, their home was on Mohican St.


Seelye did mention sights as far north as Ticonderoga, but focused on the area near Lake George Village. She starts with an introduction to area prehistory and history; she even mentions a little-known expedition led by Peter Schuyler across the lake in 1698. Her book is neatly organized into chapters and sub-headings. And her historical information is accurate and her information about hotels and accommodations is precise.

The difference between the two books is interesting - the two authors were both enthusiastic about the area, but expressed it in different ways. And it's important to remember that Seelye was writing after the post-civil war tourism boom when travel to the lake was easier. All in all an interesting look at the history of tourism in Lake George!
