

Our latest Project Local exhibit features paintings by Diane Swanson.

Diane Swanson is a visual artist based in the Lake George/Adirondack region; much of her work celebrates the lakes, mountains, woods and landscapes of the Northeast. The inherent poetry of nature and the push and pull of positive and negative space inspire her painting practice. Although her paintings are representational, she approaches her work with an eye to more abstract qualities, harmonizing atmosphere and movement with form, color and line.

The artist paints primarily in watercolor, often adding fine line pen or pen & ink line work to the composition after applying the paint, enhancing the forms and shifts in colors that her watercolor technique creates. She also creates works in gouache and occasionally oil and acrylic. The artist enjoys conveying stories with her imagery; even a simple landscape can tell a subtle tale.

Diane's work will be on display through the end of October. This exhibit is held in partnership with the Lake George Arts Project.





The Caldwell-Lake George Library Book Club will meet on Wednesday, October 9th at 6:30 pm to discuss **Demon Copperhead** by Barbara Kingsolver.

Set in the mountains of southern Appalachia, Demon Copperhead is the story of a boy born to a teenaged single mother in a single-wide trailer, with no assets beyond his dead father's good looks and copper-colored hair, a caustic wit, and a fierce talent for survival. Relayed in his own unsparing voice, Demon braves the modern perils of foster care, child labor, derelict schools, athletic success, addiction, disastrous loves, and crushing losses. Through all of it, he reckons with his own invisibility in a popular culture where even the superheroes have abandoned rural people in favor of generations ago, Charles Dickens wrote David Copperfield from his experience as a survivor of institutional poverty and its damages to children in his society. Those problems have yet to be solved in ours. Dickens is not a prerequisite for readers of this novel, but he provided its inspiration. In transposing a Victorian epic novel to the contemporary American South. Barbara Kingsolver enlists Dickens' compassion, and above all, his faith in the transformative powers of a good story. Demon Copperhead speaks for a new generation of lost boys, and all those born into beautiful, cursed places they can't imagine leaving behind.

Let's Finish What They Started: The Long and Winding Road to Women's Equality will be held at Caldwell-Lake George Library on Wednesday, October 16th at 6:30 pm. The program will highlight the history of women's rights in this nation and the possibilities that lie ahead to help women gain equal legal status to men.

Our presenter, Patricia Nugent, writes to give voice to those who might otherwise be silenced, following a career as a school district administrator and adjunct communication professor. Feeling a deep connection to our foremothers who blazed a trail, she authored the play "The Stone that Started the Ripple" about a modern-day reunion of the founding suffragists, and published the nonfiction anthology "Before They Were Our Mothers: Voices of Women Born Before Rosie Started Riveting." In 2018, she earned an Empowerment Project Award from the Saratoga Springs Public Library and, in 2023, she was recognized as a "Woman of Distinction" by NYS Assembly Representative Simpson. She designs and teaches courses in feminist history as well as in memoir, journaling, and creative writing. She chairs the Women's Rights Awareness Campaign for the Saratoga County League of Women Voters.


