

February Virtual Author Talks

Join us for an unforgettable experience as we chat with **Vanessa Riley** about her newest book, *Fire Sword and Sea*, based on the folk story of the female pirate Jacquette Delahaye. The Caribbean Sea, 1675. Jacquette Delahaye is the mixed-race daughter of a wealthy tavern owner on the island of Tortuga. Jacquette dreams of joining the seafarers and smugglers whose tall-masted ships cluster in the turquoise waters around Tortuga. For twenty years, Jacquette raids the Caribbean as Jacques, hiding her gender. When her fellow pirates decide to increase their profits by entering the slave trade, Jacquette must make a change. **Thursday, February 5th at 7 PM ET** via digital live-stream.

Feminist philosopher **Dr. Lindsey Stewart's** book, *The Conjuring of America: Mojos, Mermaids, Medicine, and 400 Years of Black Women's Magic*, tells the stories of Negro Mammies of slavery; the Voodoo Queens and Blues Women of Reconstruction; and the Granny Midwives and textile weavers of the Jim Crow era. These women, in secrecy and subterfuge, courageously and devotedly continued their practices and worship for centuries and passed down their traditions. This book is a love letter to the real magic Black women used, their herbs, food, textiles, song, and dance, used to sow rebellion, freedom, and hope. **Thursday, February 12th at 2 PM ET** via digital live-stream.



Brimming with the electrifying humor and lacerating observations that have made Everett a literary icon, this brilliant and tender novel radically illuminates Jim's agency, intelligence, and compassion as never before. *James* is destined to be a cornerstone of twenty-first century American literature.
